Food for Thought

Pambazo

Pambazos are a very common street food in Mexico, it is an antojito (very similar to the torta). This is particularly true in Mexico City, but, actually, they are originally from Xalapa, Veracruz.

Pambazos are chorizo and potato sandwiches slathered in pureed guajillo chiles.

They are often topped with lettuce, Mexican crema, salsa, and pickled red onions.

Pambazos are easy to make and yet they are absolutely delicious!

INGREDIENTS

- 2.5 Cups of Diced Potatoes
- 1 Cup Crema Fresca
- 2oz Chorizo
- 1 Cup Salsa Verde
- 3 Guajillo Peppers
- 1 Garlic Clove
- 2 Tsp. Vegetable Oil
- 1/2 Cup Shredded Lettuce
- 6 Teleras or Kaiser Rolls
- 1 Cup Crumbled Queso Fresco

1. Place diced potatoes in a saucepan with hot water over medium-high heat. It will take about 10-12 minutes for the potatoes to be cooked.
2. Put the guajillo peppers in a bowl with hot water to soften them while the potatoes are cooking.
3. In the meantime, cook the chorizo in a skillet over medium-high heat. It will be ready in 8 minutes.
4. Drain the water and add potatoes to the chorizo. Stir the potatoes and cook for 3 minutes. This is just enough time to allow the flavors to be blended and the potatoes to be a little more tender.
5. Place guajillo peppers, 1 cup of soaking water, garlic clove in a blender and process until you have a smooth sauce. Strain and place in a bowl. Heat up the griddle add 1/2 table spoon of oil.
6. Place the sliced torta bread upside down and brush their tops with the guajillo salsa. Flip the rolls so the tops get a little warm and crispy. This step will be about a minute per side. Repeat the process with the rest of the torta bread, adding oil to the skillet as needed.
7. To assemble the Pambazo, place some chorizo and potatoes on each tasted torta, then top with shredded lettuce, cream, queso fresco and salsa verde. Enjoy!

Golf Course Maintenance

Dear Members,

90-degree record-setting days in February—that is an agronomic curveball, to say the least! This month has brought a variety of climates that truly emphasize the epitome of Texas weather. What does that mean for us agronomically? Let's get into it and see what projects have been conducted in February.

As temperatures seem to increase with few signs of dropping substantially, the agronomic waters can be difficult to predict. The warm weather will push growth on almost all surfaces, demanding that we begin spring agronomic practices sooner than predicted. However, it is imperative to be patient, as there are always strong possibilities of freezing weather in late March and even early April. Beginning more aggressive practices this early in the year could result in serious setbacks as pressure is being put on the turf agronomically and environmentally. What does this mean for course conditions? Greens could be slower than desired as we are more focused on health and spring transition than lowering heights to achieve slightly higher speeds, leaving our plant vulnerable to late winter damage. Fairways, tees, and approaches may seem slightly “shaggy” as we are almost ready to lower mowing heights, but we must be patient to obtain a better understanding of the weather to come. Patience is key; this can be difficult this time of year, especially when it seems more like May than February.

While the increased temperatures have demanded more hours of input on the course than our winter project list, we are still set on finishing a few last-minute items. Throughout the month, we have accomplished a few key improvements. The horticulture team has done a fantastic job on our front entry floral enhancement, increasing the landscape size by 5x and incorporating a more aesthetically pleasing look. As we approach the renovation, fewer infrastructure improvements will be conducted. That being said, we have several areas that need to be dealt with to avoid playability issues. The team has installed a few drainage lines in the 10th fairway and a cart exit point on the 14th hole. Throughout February, we also re-seeded all fescue areas and are working to increase turf growth in key areas where our 419 Bermuda does not like to grow.

As a team member of this group, I couldn't be more pleased with the growth of our staff. The staff and managers are expected to perform at high levels daily. With project meetings, forecasting, material procurement, and planning in full swing, I have put a lot of pressure on our assistants, Aron Early, Ryan Drennan, and Gonzalo Hernandez, to ensure the daily operations are running smoothly. I would like to extend a huge thanks for their help and support, as we are entering a busy period for our department. Along with our management team, we have had several staff members step up and play huge roles in our day-to-day operations. This month, we would like to recognize Antonio Covarrubias as our team's employee of the month. Antonio has been a part of the Mira Vista agronomy team for decades and is an amazing person to work with. We can't thank him enough for all he does, and we hope Antonio sticks around for decades to come!
